

For those who have been diagnosed with COVID-19

When you test positive for COVID-19,

Your local public health center will arrange admission to a designated hospital or a lodging facility, or self-isolation at home. Please follow the directions provided,

If you test positive

If you have mild symptoms or you are asymptomatic

When admission is deemed necessary by your physician

Semi-compulsory Admission
(In accordance with the law)

If your symptoms worsen

Admission to a lodging facility or self-isolation at home

Your local public health center will monitor your health.

- Check and record your temperature twice a day: every morning and evening.
- Watch for any symptoms

- We kindly ask you to cooperate with case investigation and contact tracing performed by local public health staff. Your privacy is protected.
- Work restrictions will be applied in accordance with the law.
- Healthcare you receive during Semi-compulsory Admission or at the lodging facility will be paid for by the government. You may be required to cover for part of the cost depending on your income.

Criteria for discharge and lifting work restrictions

If you have symptoms

1. 10 days after symptom onset and 72 hours after symptoms have disappeared.
2. Results are negative from two consecutive specimens collected more than 24 hours apart and collected more than 24 hours after symptoms have disappeared.



If you are asymptomatic

1. 10 days after testing positive for COVID-19.
2. Results are negative from two consecutive specimens collected more than 24 hours apart and collected more than 6 days after testing positive.
